Reflecting on God's Word

Sitting on the Mount of Olives, maybe with a premonition or maybe wondering if all that seemed to be approaching was really the undoing he dreaded, Jesus talked to his disciples about the coming end. He made the point that when worlds change, God comes, which is different from saying that when God comes, worlds change. He talked in poetry of a collapsing world to come.

Collapsing worlds always offer the opportunity to meet God in new and unexpected ways. Our own deaths are undoubtedly the most drastic, but also the death of someone we love, a church in transition, shifting roles for men and women, a computerized age that blips and beeps across our life screens, and empty-nesting, and retirement, and marrying, and any other cosmic readjustment that you can think of. That's when the Son of Man comes, for the second time or maybe the third or fourth time, and it tends to put us in a fog, as if he were coming in the clouds.

Most of us struggle mightily to keep our worlds from collapsing. We're worked too hard to set them spinning in the orbit around our own personal suns. Yet the sooner or later they always do collapse, maybe because they lose their momentum, maybe because we lose our momentum, or maybe that's just the way it's meant to be. Whatever the reason, those are the moments when our God comes riding into our lives.

Evolving in Love

The day will come when, after harnessing space, winds, the tide and gravitation, we shall harness for God the energies of love. And, on that day, for the second time in the history of the world, [humanity] will have discovered fire. – Teilhard de Chardin

Pierre Teilhard de Chardin (1881– 1955), the brilliant French Jesuit priest, mystic, and paleontologist, had much to say about love. Louis Savary, a theologian, and Patricia Berne, a psychologist, have been studying Teilhard's writings for many years and finding ways to help others understand his work. Today I offer some of their insights:

God created this evolving universe because God is Love and each of us is God's gift to the world. Our life purpose is to make a difference in transforming that world...

For Teilhard, "love is the most universal, the most tremendous and the most mysterious of the cosmic forces." Love is both human and divine. Divine love is the energy that brought the universe into being and binds it together. Human love is whatever energy we use to help divine love achieve its purpose...

Love of God and love of one another lies at the core of every traditional *religion*. Love not only permeates those religions, it transcends them and binds them together. Divine love embraces everyone and everything. There is nothing outside the divine embrace...

From Teilhard's perspective, then, *helping the human family move toward the next step of human evolution in love is the most urgent and challenging task of contemporary spirituality...*

For Teilhard, love...is the essential nature of God, and the best name for God (see 1 John 4:8). As Teilhard envisioned it, divine love is the self-expressive creative force that gave birth to our evolving universe. It is the same divine love that continuously keeps every atom of creation existing and moving forward on its grand evolutionary journey back to God...

It was for love of all created beings that God the Father sent his Son into the world that we might learn of God's love for us and [that he might] show us how to live "The Way" of love (see John 3:16-17)...

According to Teilhard, God has implanted a divine spark of love in everything created, down to every last subatomic particle and photon of light...That spark in each of us waits to be cultivated and developed until it matures...

In contemporary language, Teilhard might say that God has an evolutionary "project" for creation that God wants to accomplish...God wants creation to become fully conscious that it is imbued with divine love and living in that love. This final outcome is what Teilhard called "the omega Point" and St. Paul called the Pleroma. [See Colossians 2:9-10.]

Sick and Homebound Visitation

We are a parish family. The priests and laity who bring Holy Communion are delighted to share with you the Body of Christ. If one of the priests visits, he can also share Sacramental Absolution and the Sacrament of the Anointing of Sick (Holy Oils).

We need your help. When you or a family member are sick at home, whether for a short period, home with a chronic illness, or simply homebound, we are happy to visit. You can help us by calling the rectory, so we can set a time to visit at your convenience.

The Anointing of the Sick is not just for life threatening illness but for any illness—cancer, pre-surgery, depression... The sacrament is for the sick and prays for healing. It is not Last Rites or Extreme Unction. (These terms were deleted 50 years ago as a result of Vatican II.) We look forward to visiting you.

Hospital Visitations

With today's HIPPA regulations...that is, **the right of privacy for hospital patients**, clergy have difficulty knowing if/when parishioners are hospitalized. Even, if when registering you identify yourself as a Catholic, it does not guarantee you will be visited by a priest or Eucharistic Minister from Assumption because we are not informed by the hospital.

Please call the rectory if you wish a priest or Eucharistic Minister to visit you. All parishes provide for the salary of priests on duty in our Fairfield County hospitals—hospital chaplains. While in the hospital you or a family member are able to ask for the **Hospital Catholic Chaplain** to visit and provide the sacraments.
