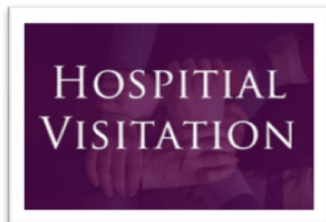
Parish Happenings
