The Placement of the Tabernacle

As announced at all masses last weekend, we are planning to move the tabernacle from the side altar to the center of the sanctuary. The Parish Finance and Pastoral Councils were informed and the project was approved by the bishop.

Why is this change being made?

1. The *General Instruction on the Roman Missal* (no. 276) states that the Tabernacle should be placed in a location in the Church that is prominent. The current location of the tabernacle, while beautiful, is not prominent. In fact, the celebrant's chair is currently more prominent. The presider at Mass should not be in a position that is more prominent than our Lord in the Eucharist.
2. Placing the Eucharist at the center of the sanctuary is a visible reminder that when we gather as a parish community for the celebration of the Eucharist (which Vatican II calls the "source and summit of our lives"), our Lord Jesus is the center of our worship. Our gathering for prayer does not revolve around the celebrant but instead around Jesus. The tabernacle then, should have that place of prominence.
3. When our church was originally built, the tabernacle was in the center of the sanctuary. Moving the tabernacle back is a restoration of the original plan and architectural design of the church.

Some other Frequently asked questions:

1. How much is this going to cost? The tabernacle will simply be picked up and moved. A new pedestal will be installed for the tabernacle to be placed upon. The statue of the Blessed Mother that was donated to our church a few months ago will be put on the pedestal where the tabernacle is currently located right now. A parishioner has generously donated funds to cover the cost of this simple project.
2. Was anyone consulted? Yes. The Parish Council and the Finance Council along with parish staff. Finally, the Diocesan Sacred Arts Committee approved the plan.
3. What should I do now when I enter the Church as a sign of reverence? The customary reverence is to genuflect on one knee (the right knee) toward the tabernacle whenever one passes in front of it or before entering your pew. If genuflecting is difficult for physical reasons, a reverent bow is appropriate.
4. What do the red candles mean? The red candles burn as vigil lights, indicating that the Blessed Sacrament is present in the tabernacle.
